Gregory D. Smith (Chair)

Executive vice president of Enterprise Operations and chief financial officer, The Boeing Company



Gregory D. Smith was elected to Intel's board of directors in March 2017. He is the executive vice president of Enterprise Operations and chief financial officer at Boeing Company, the world's largest aerospace company and one of the largest U.S. exporters.

Smith leads Boeing's newly formed Enterprise Operations, Finance and Strategy organization. In this expanded role, Smith manages the company's overall financial activities and drives operational excellence by overseeing the company's manufacturing, operations, supply chain, quality, and program management functions. Smith is also responsible for the delivery of enterprise services across the company and oversees the company's strengthened focus on sustainability.

Additionally, Smith maintains oversight of the company's financial performance, reporting, long-range business planning, Treasury and Controller organizations, as well as investor relations. Smith also has executive responsibility for the company's global financing arm, Boeing Capital Corp. And he oversees the company's corporate audit function, which reports directly to the board of directors.

Smith has three decades of in-depth global aerospace experience across Boeing's Commercial Airplanes; Defense, Space & Security; and corporate headquarters. He was appointed chief financial officer in 2011 and later served in an expanded role as the executive vice president of Finance, Enterprise Performance and Strategy. He previously was corporate controller and vice president of Finance, serving as the company's principal interface with the board of directors audit committee to ensure regulatory compliance.

Earlier in his career, Smith was vice president of Corporate Financial Planning and Analysis, leading business plan development, financial forecasting, financial analysis and capital commitment planning, as well as competitive analysis and benchmarking. Smith rejoined Boeing in 2008 after holding the position of vice president of Global Investor Relations at Raytheon. Before Raytheon, Smith held key leadership roles in supply chain, factory operations, finance and program management at Boeing.

Smith serves on the board of directors of Lurie Children's Hospital and Northwestern Memorial Healthcare.

**Jon Huntsman
(Vice Chair)**

*Ambassador Jon M.
Huntsman, Jr.*



Jon Huntsman currently serves as vice chairman of Ford Motor Co. He has spent considerable time in public service at the state, national and international levels. Huntsman began his career in public service as a staff assistant to President Ronald Reagan. He has served each of the five U.S. presidents since then in critical roles around the world, including as the ambassador to Singapore, deputy assistant secretary of Commerce for Asia, U.S. trade ambassador, U.S. ambassador to China and most recently, U.S. ambassador to Russia. Huntsman is the only American ambassador in history to have served as chief of mission in both China and Russia. In all four Senate confirmations, he received unanimous votes.

Twice elected governor of Utah, Governor Huntsman brought about strong economic and tax reforms, tripled the state's rainy-day fund, and helped bring unemployment rates to historic lows. Historically, Huntsman was one of Utah's most popular governors, reaching approval ratings as high as 90%. During his tenure, Utah was named the best managed state in America and ranked No. 1 in the nation in job growth. Recognized by others for his service, Governor Huntsman was elected as chairman of the Western Governors Association, serving 19 states throughout the region.

Ambassador Huntsman was a candidate for the presidency in 2012, where he ultimately placed third in the New Hampshire primary before bowing out. He currently serves on the boards of Ford Motor Co. and Chevron and has previously served as chairman of the Atlantic Council and on the boards of Caterpillar Corp. and Hilton. He has also previously served as a trustee of the U.S. Naval Academy Foundation, the University of Pennsylvania, the Reagan Presidential Foundation, as well as chairman of the Huntsman Cancer Foundation. He was recently inducted into the American Academy of Diplomacy and has received the U.S. State Department's top honor — the Distinguished Service Award — along with the highest recognition from the CIA for distinguished service.

Huntsman is a seventh-generation Utahn and has been married for 36 years to Mary Kaye Huntsman. Together they are the parents of seven children, including two adopted daughters from China and India. His two sons, both graduates of the U.S. Naval Academy, are active duty naval officers. Huntsman is a graduate of the University of Pennsylvania and has 10 ten honorary doctoral degrees.

Erich Clementi

Erich Clementi is deputy chairman of the supervisory board of E.ON SE and member of the board at Lufthansa AG.

Clementi spent 34 years at IBM, serving first in European and later in global roles across many of its divisions.

From 2015 to 2019 he served as senior vice president of IBM, Global Markets and chairman of IBM Europe, and was responsible for all IBM Sales in North America and Europe. Prior senior roles at IBM included the worldwide responsibility for IBM's mainframe business and corporate strategy, and worldwide leadership of IBM's largest business, Global Technology Services.

Clementi holds a degree in business administration from the Leopold-Franzens-University of Innsbruck in Austria.

Michèle Flournoy
Co-founder and managing partner, WestExec Advisors



Michèle Flournoy is co-founder and managing partner of WestExec Advisors and co-founder, former chief executive officer and now chair of the Center for a New American Security (CNAS).

Flournoy served as the undersecretary of defense for policy from February 2009 to February 2012. She was the principal adviser to the secretary of defense in the formulation of national security and defense policy, oversight of military plans and operations, and in National Security Council deliberations. She led the development of the Department of Defense's 2012 strategic guidance and represented the department in dozens of foreign engagements, in the media and before Congress.

Prior to confirmation, Flournoy co-led President Obama's transition team at the Defense Department.

In January 2007, Flournoy co-founded Center for a New American Security (CNAS), a bipartisan think tank dedicated to developing strong, pragmatic and principled national security policies. She served as CNAS' president until 2009 and returned as CEO in 2014. In 2017, she co-founded WestExec Advisors, a strategic advisory firm.

Previously, she was senior advisor at the Center for Strategic and International Studies and prior to that a distinguished research professor at the Institute for National Strategic Studies at the National Defense University.

In the mid-1990s, she served as principal deputy assistant secretary of defense for Strategy and Threat Reduction and deputy assistant secretary of defense for Strategy.

Flournoy is the recipient of numerous honors and awards, including the American Red Cross Exceptional Service Award in 2016; the Department of Defense Medal for Distinguished Public Service in 1998, 2011 and 2012; the Chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff's Joint Distinguished Civilian Service Award in 2000 and 2012; the Secretary of Defense Medal for Outstanding Public Service in 1996; and CARE's Global Peace, Development and Security Award in 2019.

She has edited several books and authored dozens of reports and articles on a broad range of defense and national security issues. Flournoy frequently appears in national and international media, including CNN's "State of the Union," ABC's "This Week," NBC's "Meet the Press," "BBC News," NPR's "Morning Edition" and "All Things Considered" and PBS's "News Hour," and is frequently quoted in top-tier newspapers.

Flournoy serves on the boards of CNAS, Booz Allen Hamilton, Amida Technology Solutions, The Mission Continues and CARE. She serves on the advisory boards of The Leadership Council for Women in National Security, Sesame Workshop, Intel and PIMCO. She is a senior fellow at Harvard's Belfer Center for Science and International Affairs, a current member of the Council on Foreign Relations and the Aspen Strategy Group, and a former member of the President's Intelligence Advisory Board, the CIA Director's External Advisory Board and the Defense Policy Board.

Flournoy earned a bachelor's degree in social studies from Harvard University and a master's degree in international relations from Balliol College, Oxford University, where she was a Newton-Tatum Scholar.

Fred Kempe

President and CEO, Atlantic Council



Fred Kempe is the president and chief executive officer of the Atlantic Council. Under his leadership since 2007, the council has achieved historic, industry-leading growth in size and influence, expanding its work through regional centers spanning the globe and through centers focused on topics ranging from international security and energy to global trade and next generation leadership.

Before joining the council, Kempe was a prize-winning editor and reporter at The Wall Street Journal for more than 25 years. In New York, he served as assistant managing editor, International and columnist. Prior to that, he was the longest-serving editor and associate publisher ever of The Wall Street Journal Europe, running the global Wall Street Journal's editorial operations in Europe and the Middle East.

He is the author of four books. The most recent, "Berlin 1961: Kennedy, Khrushchev, and the Most Dangerous Place on Earth," was a New York Times bestseller and a national bestseller.

Kempe is a graduate of the University of Utah and has a master's degree from Columbia University's Graduate School of Journalism, where he was a member of the International Fellows program in the School of International Affairs.

Robert M. Kimmitt

Senior international counsel at WilmerHale and lead independent director at Facebook



Robert M. Kimmitt is senior international counsel at the law firm of WilmerHale. He is also lead independent director at Facebook.

Ambassador Kimmitt has held a wide variety of senior positions at the intersection of international business, finance and public policy. From 2005 to 2009, he served as deputy secretary of the U.S. Treasury, where he had significant responsibility for the department's international agenda, including his leadership role on the Committee on Foreign Investment in the United States.

Earlier, he was U.S. ambassador to Germany; undersecretary of state for Political Affairs; and general counsel to the U.S. Treasury. He also served in the Reagan administration House as National Security Council executive secretary and general counsel, with the rank of deputy assistant to the president for National Security Affairs.

In addition to his government service, Ambassador Kimmitt served as executive vice president, Global Public Policy at Time Warner from 2001 to 2005. Prior to that, he was vice chairman and president of Commerce One, a Silicon Valley software company. He was a partner at Wilmer, Cutler & Pickering, a managing director of Lehman Brothers, and a partner in the law firm of Sidley & Austin.

Ambassador Kimmitt was chairman of the CIA External Advisory Board; chairman of the State Department Foreign Affairs Policy Board and a member of the National Security Council Leadership Initiative. He was a member of the Director of Central Intelligence's National Security Advisory Panel and a member of the National Defense Panel. He also served as a member of the Panel of Arbitrators of the World Bank's International Centre for the Settlement of Investment Disputes.

Ambassador Kimmitt graduated with distinction from the U.S. Military Academy at West Point in 1969. After finishing first in his Ranger School class, he served in combat in Vietnam from 1970 to 1971 with the 173rd Airborne Brigade, earning three Bronze Star Medals, the Purple Heart, the Air Medal and the Vietnamese Cross of Gallantry. He retired as a major general in the Army Reserve. He received his law degree from Georgetown University in 1977, where he was editor-in-chief of Law & Policy in International Business, and clerked for Judge Edward Tamm on the U.S. Court of Appeals for the D.C. Circuit. He holds an honorary doctor of humane letters degree from Marymount University, the Distinguished Graduate Award from West Point and the Outstanding Alumnus Award from the U.S. Army War College.

Ambassador Kimmitt serves on the Global Advisory Board of Tokai Tokyo Financial Holdings, as well as the International Advisory Board of The Maureen and Mike Mansfield Foundation. He is a member of the American Academy of Diplomacy, the Council on Foreign Relations and the Trilateral Commission. He is chairman emeritus of the American Council on Germany, and his foreign language is German.

Janet Napolitano

Professor of public policy and founder and faculty director of the center for security in politics at UC Berkeley



Janet Napolitano is a professor of Public Policy at the Goldman School of Public Policy and the founder and faculty director of the Center for Security in Politics at the University of California, Berkeley. She served as the 20th president of the University of California, the nation's largest public research university with 10 campuses, five medical centers, three affiliated national laboratories, and a statewide agriculture and natural resources program. Prior to joining the University of California, Napolitano served as U.S. secretary of Homeland Security from 2009 to 2013.

She is a former two-term governor of Arizona, a former attorney general of Arizona, and a former U.S. attorney for the District of Arizona. In 2019, Napolitano published "How Safe Are We? Homeland Security Since 9/11." Napolitano earned her bachelor's degree, summa cum laude, in political science from Santa Clara University, and her Juris Doctor degree from the University of Virginia. She is based in Berkeley, California.

Yuanqing Yang

Chairman & CEO, Lenovo



Mr. Yuanqing Yang joined the Lenovo Group in 1989 and has played a key role in Lenovo's transformation into a \$60 billion global organization with 63,000 employees operating in 180 markets around the world.

Under his leadership, Lenovo completed the acquisition of the IBM PC business in May 2005 and the acquisitions of the IBM x86 server business and Motorola Mobility in October 2014. Now, Lenovo is not only the No. 1 PC company in the world, but one of the major players in the global server and smartphone markets. Beyond its core business groups, Lenovo also focuses on several transformational areas including Internet of Things, cloud computing, edge computing and big data.

Lenovo has been recognized extensively for its leadership and innovation, including ranked on Fortune's list of World's Most Admired Companies and cited as one of Thomson Reuter's Top 100 Global Tech Leaders. Lenovo was also ranked on Gartner's list of the world's Top 25 Global Supply Chains and #No. 224 on the Fortune Global 500 list.

Mr. Yang has been the recipient of multiple awards and industry accolades. In 2011, Finance Asia voted Mr. Yang the Best CEO in China. In 2004 and 2012, Mr. Yang was named "CCTV China Annual Economic Figure." He was on Barron's Best CEOs list from 2013 to 2015, and in 2014 won the Edison Achievement Award. In 2020, Mr. Yang was named as one of China's Most Influential Business Leaders by Fortune (China) magazine.

Mr. Yang was born in Anhui Province of China in 1964. He received a master's degree in computer science from the University of Science and Technology of China, and a bachelor's degree in computer science and engineering from Shanghai Jiao Tong University. He serves as a member of the International Advisory Council of Brookings Institute; a board member of Baidu Inc. and TaiKang Insurance Group.
